Social change among the poor in the townships of South Africa through organic vegetable gardening. Funding was needed to provide on-going training and follow up work with approximately 111 indigent survivalists wanting to get involved.

The grant has been used for:

- 10 training courses in Basic Organic Vegetable Gardening
- 20 householders trained in propagation and care of indigenous plants
- Six capacity building and support workshops with the first black organic urban farmers association in the history of South Africa.
