<b>Were you able to undertake your project as planned?</b>	Yes
<b>Can you describe and/or demonstrate the specific impact that TFN funding has had against your initial objectives?</b>	Our local partners have been able to hire a project manager in Kenya and a Project Co-ordinator in Uganda for the project. This is our first attempt at applying our methods at a location far from our original base in Kenya. We are now working in 4 pilot villages in Uganda as planned, and 40 households are actively involved in the project. We have delivered 5 workshops to the local people in the last 12 months, covering hygiene, disease prevention and how to organise a village health committee. Household latrine coverage has been increased from 35% to 75%, 10 local people have been trained to install smokeless stoves and 36 stoves have been installed so far. 100% of the pilot households have started using mosquito nets and over 25% have started treating their drinking water. 5 households in each village are now "model homesteads" which have adopted all the basic healthy practices.

<p><b>Do you have any other comments or feedback on the experience of the TFN process?</b></p>	<p>It was an enjoyable and stimulating process, and one which I have recommended to many other small charities!</p>
<p><b>Can you tell us any personal stories to highlight the value of the project?</b></p>	<p>Lucy Drijaru is a disabled woman, unable to walk, and is also the mother of a four year old daughter. During our first visit to Uganda we met her coming from her farm carrying firewood on her head and crawling all the way to her house. We installed a smokeless stove in Lucy's house in August 2017. Now Lucy has reduced health risks for herself and her child, and will save time and effort in collecting firewood.</p> <p>Two months after the smokeless stove was installed in her house. Lucy had this to say: "I'm very grateful to you for installing the smokeless stove in my house which has saved me a lot of hassle collecting firewood and cooking. I have reduced the number of times I need to collect firewood from 10 times to 3 times per week, and this has also reduced the cost of firewood. I used to spend 4,000 Uganda shillings (\$1) every week, but now I no longer buy firewood as the wood I collect myself is enough. I am using the money I save to buy my child her needs. I'm a happy mother too, as I can now cook with my child around in the kitchen."</p>
